

MICHIGAN'S COVID-19 VACCINATION DISTRIBUTION

GOAL #1: GET AT LEAST 70% OF MICHIGANDERS AGE 16 AND OLDER VACCINATED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

- There are approximately 8 million people 16 and older that will be eligible for the vaccine.
- Therefore, our 70% goal means 5.6M residents vaccinated as soon as possible.

GOAL #2: GET 50,000 SHOTS IN ARMS EACH DAY AS SOON AS THE TRUMP ADMINISTRATION PROVIDES US WITH THE DOSES WE NEED.

WHAT WE'RE DOING:

- Set a goal to use 90% of doses in 7 days. Our providers have all worked diligently to meet this goal.
- Modified phase 1b and allowed 1b to start while 1a was still going.
- Providing Michigan National Guard support for data and administering vaccines.
- Packaging and sending PPE shipments across the state.
- Helping with 211 and scheduling apps for providers that may need technology assistance.
- Partnering with private organizations to secure spaces for vaccinations.
- Linking pharmacies and providers to help put more shots in arms.

AS A RESULT OF THESE STRATEGIC MOVES, SHOTS IN ARMS FOR THE LAST WEEK WENT FROM 12K PER DAY TO OVER 33K PER DAY.

WHAT WE NEED: HELP FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.

- Governor Whitmer recently led a team of nine governors requesting that the Trump Administration release the millions of doses of the safe and effective vaccine they are currently holding back, and they have granted our request.
- Governor Whitmer has urged the Trump Administration to grant her permission to purchase 100,000 doses of the safe and effective COVID vaccine to speed up distribution and put more shots in arms.
- Michigan and states across the country are ready to speed up distribution, but the federal government needs to step up and take action.

AS SOON AS WE GET THE SUPPLY WE NEED, WE WILL BEGIN MOVING CLOSER TO OUR 50,000 SHOTS PER DAY GOAL.
